

PRESIDENT'S & MANAGER'S REPORT

It is our privilege on behalf of Consumers Energy's directors, management, and employees to report on some of the activities and financial position of the cooperative for the year 2022 and to provide information for 2023 to date.

The cooperative's Board of Directors and management continue to focus on Consumers Energy's core electric distribution business. A cost-conscious approach is used in managing the cooperative. This has contributed to positive financial performance and margins that are reflected in Consumers Energy's 2023 vear-to-date financial statements.

Consumers Energy is a cooperative, and its members are the owners of this company. The amount a member pays for electricity and services provided by the cooperative that is not needed to operate Consumers Energy is paid back in the future to members as patronage capital credits. For the 2022 calendar year, the board chose to pay back patronage capital credits in the amount of \$500,000.

The cooperative has 24 full-time employees. We are most grateful to them for the effort and dedication they put forth to provide the membership with reliable electricity and energy advice. While we focus on the needs of our members, we also address the needs of our employees so the work in the office and out in the field can be performed safely and efficiently.

There are nine members serving on the cooperative's Board of Directors. The board annually holds 12 regular meetings and occasional special meetings. The directors also attend training seminars and meetings of affiliated state, regional, and national organizations and serve as the cooperative's delegates. Their participation in these meetings help the cooperative have a well-informed Board of Directors.

The financial report listed in this annual report provides the facts of the financial position of Consumers Energy as of December 31, 2022. The 2022 audit of the cooperative's financial statements was successfully completed by our auditor, Eide Bailly LLP, in March of this year. GUEST SPEAKER: ANDREW ST. JOHN



In June 2023, Andrew St. John was named Executive Vice President & CEO of Central Iowa Power Cooperative (CIPCO). Andrew joined CIPCO in 2016, as Vice President & CFO, where he was responsible for overseeing the accounting and finance operations of CIPCO, financial risk mitigation, wholesale rate design, and investment strategy. In addition, Andrew played an influential role on the team responsible for executing CIPCO's most recent strategic plan that led to a modernized wholesale power contract with CIPCO's Member-owners. managed through the retirement of Duane Arnold Energy Center, and brought 157 MW of new wind, 106 MW of solar, and 55 MW of dispatchable natural gas capacity into the CIPCO resource portfolio.

Prior to joining CIPCO, St. John oversaw financial reporting at Businessolver, Inc. and served power & utilities clients within Deloitte & Touche, LLP's audit practice. Andrew is a graduate of the University of Northern Iowa with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Accounting. He is an Iowa-licensed CPA. Andrew has been active in the Des Moines business community and has been involved in local civic organizations. He was a member of the Leadership Iowa Class of 2022-2023 and has served as a Director of the National Renewables Cooperative Organization. Andrew and his wife, Natalie, are residents of Polk City along with their daughter Charlotte.




